*Minister-President of the Government of Flanders, Flemish Minister for Foreign Affairs, Culture, Digitalisation and Facility Management. ### **Mr. Nayden Todorov**

Minister of Culture of Bulgaria

*Nayden Todorov graduated with honours from the Dobrin Petkov School of Music in Plovdiv. In 2000, he was invited to become the Music Director of the Plovdiv Opera and Philharmonic, proving to be the youngest conductor in Bulgaria in such a position. Since 2017 he has been the director of the Sofia Philharmonic Orchestra, with which he has performed at some of the most prestigious venues in Europe. In 2013 and 2019 he was voted "Musician of the Year" by the listeners of the Bulgarian National Radio. In 2014, he was awarded the Emil Chakarov Prize. In 2015 he was awarded the title of "Honorary Citizen" of the city of Ruse. He has also received awards from the Slovak Music Fund, the Rotary Club of Vienna, the Borghese Foundation, the Sofia Prize for the production of the opera Faust at the National Opera and Ballet, the Golden Petolinie for his contribution to the development of Bulgarian music, the Golden Book for his contribution to the development of Bulgarian culture, the George Wächter Foundation Award - Switzerland, etc. In 2020 he became the fourth winner of the Bogdan Bogdanov Prize for Humanities of the New Bulgarian University. Because of his mastery in creating international musical projects and for his outstanding artistic successes on stages around the world, he received the prestigious Italian Aquila d'Oro Award in the autumn of 2023. In 2021, he published his first book of short stories, A Whiff of Angels. In the period February-June 2023, he is interim Minister of Culture.*



### **Dr. Lina Mendoni**

Minister of Culture of Greece

*Lina G. Mendoni has a Bachelor's degree in Classical Philology and History and Archaeology and a PhD in Archaeology cum laude from the University of Athens. She received a scholarship from the British Archaeological School at Athens for a post-doctoral study on ancient Greek onomastics in Oxford. She was a member of the research staff at the Institute of Greek and Roman Antiquity (now Institute of Historical Research) of the National Hellenic Research Foundation, where she still serves as a Principal Researcher. Lina Mendoni is a member of several domestic and foreign academic organizations, societies and unions. She is also a leader or member of scientific committees in the context of European and international research programs. Her academic interests include ancient Greek epigraphy, history and topography, the study of landscape as a cultural good, the protection, promotion and management of cultural heritage, the theory and politics of Culture. She is the author of monographs and numerous articles published in international scientific journals, conference proceedings and collective volumes. She has also co-edited five collective volumes. She served as a Special Scientific Advisor to the Hellenic Ministry of Environment, Planning and Public Works from 1994 to 1997, and to the Hellenic Ministry for the Aegean from 1997 to 1999. From March 1999 to March 2004 Lina Mendoni was Secretary General of the Hellenic Ministry of Culture, and from November 2009 to January 2015 of the Ministries of Culture and Tourism, Culture and Sports, and Education and Religious Affairs, Culture and Sports successively.*

### **Ms Nina Obuljen Koržinek**

Minister of Culture and Media of Croatia

*Nina Obuljen Koržinek, Minister of Culture and Media of the Republic of Croatia, has more than 25 years of professional experience in the fields of international relations, culture and media policies. She graduated from the Academy of Music and Faculty of Philosophy and obtained her Ph.D. from the Faculty of Political Sciences. Prior to her appointment as the Minister of Culture in 2016, she was working as a research associate at the Institute for Development and International Relations in Zagreb. She is publishing books and articles as well as expert studies in Croatian and international journals and teaches at the University of Zagreb.*

*Her consultancy and expert engagements include work for UNESCO, Council of Europe, European Cultural Foundation, UNDP, European Parliament etc. She received the European Cultural Policy Research Award for her research on the impact of the EU enlargement on cultural policies that was published in the book *Why we need European Cultural Policies: impact of EU enlargement on countries in transition*, Amsterdam, 2006.*



### **Mr. Gennaro Sangiuliano**

Minister of Culture of Italy

*Gennaro Sangiuliano graduated in Law from the University Federico II and obtained a PhD in Law and Economics at the same University. He holds a Master's degree in European Private Law. From 1999 to 2001, he was the Editor-in-Chief of the daily newspaper "Roma" in Naples, then Deputy Editor of the daily newspaper Libero. He collaborates with Il Foglio, l'Espresso and Il Sole 24 Ore. He has served as Director of the School of Journalism at the University of Salerno and is currently a professor of Economic History at LUISS Guido Carli and of Information Law at LUMSA in Rome. In 2003 he joined RAI and became Head of Service of TGR in Naples. In 2004 he moved to Rome to the TGR National Agency where he became Deputy Chief Editor in 2005 and Chief Editor in 2007. In 2009 he moved to Tg1 where he became Deputy Editor. From November 2018 to October 2022 he is Director of Tg2. Author of numerous historical and scholarly essays, including: the university legal-economic textbook *Theory and Techniques of New Media*; the entry *Communication Economics* in Treccani's work *XXI Century*; the biography of the founder of *La Voce*, Giuseppe Prezzolini, the conservative anarchist; the historical essay *Checkmate the Czar: 1908-1910: Lenin on Capri, genesis of the revolution*; biographies of Ronald Reagan, Vladimir Putin, Hillary Clinton, Donald Trump, and Xi Jinping. As of October 22, 2022, he is Minister of Culture.*

### **Dr. Vasiliki Kassianidou**

Deputy Minister of Culture of the Republic of Cyprus

*Dr Vasiliki Kassianidou has a double major in Chemistry and Classical and Near Eastern Archaeology from the Bryn Mawr College and a doctoral degree from the Institute of Archaeology, University College London. From 2015 to 2019 she was the Director of the Archaeological Research Unit of the University of Cyprus. From 2014 -2016 she served as the President of the Board of Trustees of the Cultural Foundation of the Bank of Cyprus. In 2014 she was appointed to the Board of Directors of the Cyprus National Commission for UNESCO. In 2018 the Ministers Council of the Republic of Cyprus appointed her as a member of the Board of Directors of the National Board of Research and Innovation. In 2022 she was elected Corresponding Member of the Archaeological Institute of America. Her research focuses on ancient technology and specifically on the production and trade of Cypriot copper through antiquity, as well as on the impact of this industry on the Cypriot landscape and environment. She has taken part and directed numerous field and analytical projects regarding her fields of expertise and has an extensive list of publications which include five edited volumes, two co-authored volumes and over one hundred articles in peer reviewed journals, edited volumes and conference proceedings.*



### **Ms. Agnese Logina**

Minister of Culture of the Republic of Latvia

*Since 15 September 2023, Minister for Culture of the Republic of Latvia. Previous positions include Deputy at the Riga City Council (2020 – 2023) and Head of Riga Film Museum of the Latvian Academy of Culture (2021 –2023). Ms. Logina has served as guest lecturer of the course "Fundamentals of Culture and Art Awareness", Latvian Academy of Culture (2019 – 2021), as Curator at Riga Film Museum of the Latvian Academy of Culture (2015 – 2021), and Curator of the Baltic Music Video Competition of the Riga International Film Festival (2015 – 2023). Since 2015, she has issued regular publications on films and cultural topics in various cultural and artistic media (Kino Raksti, Satori, Delfi, Latvijas Avīze, Rīgas Laiks)*

Helping the cultural heritage sector to use 3D technologies: from high-resolution 3D captures to impressive VR experiences

*The Giravolt is a national project in Catalonia coordinated by the Catalan Department of Culture GENCAT, and is associated partner of EUreka3D, sharing its purposes and vision, promoting 3D digitisation of cultural heritage items for scopes of research and dissemination.*

*Giravolt project has digitised the plaster replica of "Dead Lucretia", a sculpture (preserved in the Biblioteca Museu Víctor Balaguer) that is considered one of the most unique examples of Catalan and European Neoclassicism.*

*Having a 3D model of the plaster not only allows us to uncover the history behind the sculpture, but also gives us the chance to examine in great detail its craftsmanship and formal intricacies, that wouldn't be possible to observe in person, due the work's elevated pedestal.*



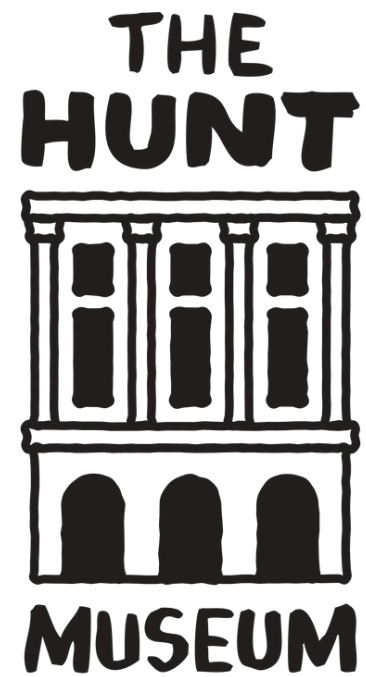
