**'eCloud: Tools and Content for Humanities Research'**,

at the NIOD in the historic center of Amsterdam, Nov.11-12, 2013

Engagement with researchers working in fields of the humanities is key to the success of the project, ensuring their requirements are fully understood and incorporated into the projected infrastructure. For this purpose we wish to engage with potential end-users of Europeana Research to solicit suggestions on types of content and research tools for the platform.

Researchers from several subject domains in the humanities have been invited or will be approached soon: from archaeologists and musicologists to scholars in classical, medieval and philosophical studies, law and GIS-specialists.

The WP's Advisory Board will also be represented.

The agenda has not yet been finalized, but we plan to actively engage some 12-15 specialists and query them on the best possible combinations between

- a. the tools and content they use and apply in their research and
- b. current and prospective content in Europeana,
- c. the needs and opportunities in developing (specific) 'tool boxes' within Europeana.
